CURRICULUM

Welcome to BridgePrep, we are so glad you joined us this year! Our new reading curriculum (Reading Mastery) and summer teacher training has ignited lots of excitement for the learning of our scholars this year. K-2 reading curriculum is a phonics system based on concretely learning the rules for reading. Grades 3-8 reading curriculum (Reading Reconsidered) is a novel based study to teach students to read like champions-with rigor independence, precision, and insight. Grades 9-10 curriculum (Study Sync) is a living curriculum with rich multimedia and captivating resources added every day. All of our reading curriculum this year integrates rigorous writing throughout the genres. Our K-6 math program (Go Math) helps scholars to develop a deeper and more analytical understanding of math with plenty of visuals and hands-on activities. Our 6-8 math curriculum (Envision Math) focuses on deep conceptual math understanding that provides a pathway to success for every scholar.

STATE TESTING



Fast state testing is coming up in September.
For K-2 the test it's called STAR Early Literacy,
Reading and Math. Grades 3-10 the test is called
FAST Reading and Math Assessment. Both of these
tests will access our scholars' knowledge of the Florida

This activity is always ready and prepared for them to practice skills that they just learned and can do independently. Coming into the classroom this way will set the tone for excellent learning. We are also working on our Scholars



transitioning throughout the hallways quietly as other classes are still learning and are not to be interrupted. Students are being taught to track the person speaking whether it is the teacher of another student. We are also using the strategies of Choral responses and cold calling. These strategies are scientifically studied and proven to be effective engaging strategies.

One of our problem areas that we need support from parents is our phone policy. This year at BridgePrep phones are not allowed out at all from the beginning of the day to dismissal. Reasons for this rule is to eliminate interrupted learning by using the phone, playing games, or on apps such at twitter and Facebook. Also, we cannot monitor what students are doing on their phones because we are busy teaching. Phones will be confiscated during the day if they are out and the scholars can pick them up from the office at the end of the day.
